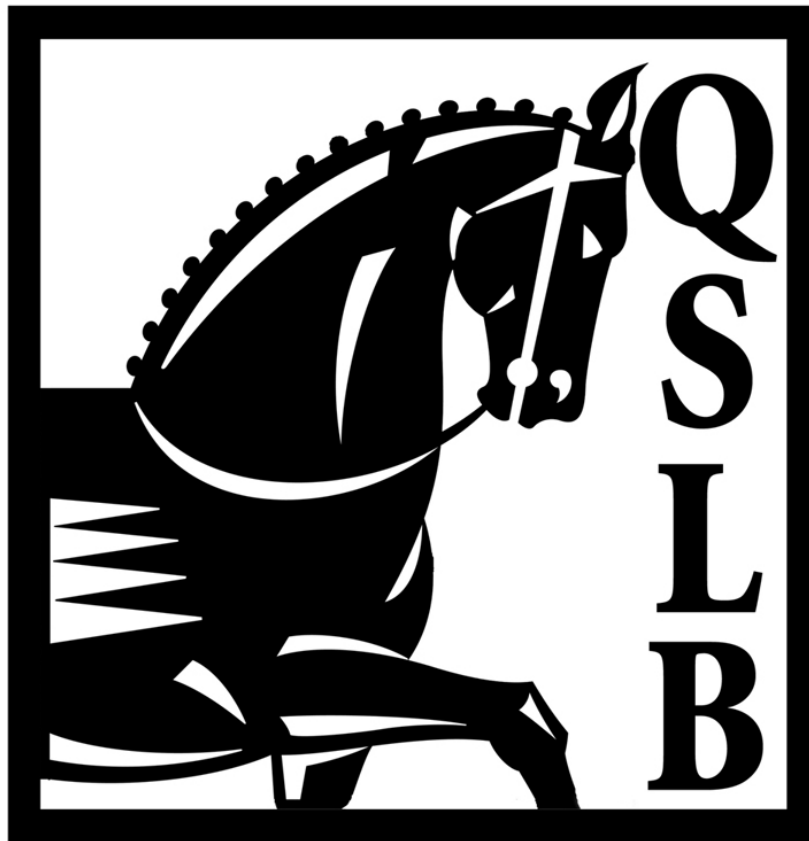

ENTRANTS IN ALL QSLB SHOWS REQUIRE AN O.E.F. MEMBERSHIP

Please note that QSLB is holding our Gold Shows and our Silver Shows on a different day than our Bronze shows. Please check the dates carefully.

EC rules will be strictly followed. Every class herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules and will be held and judged in accordance with the current EC Rule Book

The QSLB competitions are sanctioned as Gold, Silver, or Bronze competition members of Equine Canada (EC) and are governed by the rules of EC.

Knowledge of the EC rules is the responsibility of each competitor.

Required memberships: All competitors must hold a relevant Provincial Sport Organization (PSO) membership, an EC Bronze or Silver or Gold Sport License, and, for Gold competitions only, must be either a Dressage Canada senior or junior member. All horses and ponies entered in Silver or Gold competitions must have a valid EC passport with current horse license (sticker).

ALL tests used will be the EC tests available at www.dressagecanada.org (the only exceptions are the Walk/Trot Tests 'A' through 'F', printed in this booklet, Walk/Trot Freestyle and Training level Freestyle, which will be the Cadora tests available at www.cadora.ca. These tests will be offered as 'EC Miscellaneous classes').

PLEASE NOTE THERE ARE *NEW* TESTS TRAINING THROUGH 4TH LEVEL FOR 2011.

There will be a Dressage Canada Levy fee of \$7.00 per entry charged. For more information about the DC Levy Program see www.dressagecanada.org

EQUINE CANADA STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLE

Equine Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

EC is committed to:

- ◇ Upholding the welfare of the horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- ◇ Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- ◇ Ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- ◇ Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- ◇ Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- ◇ Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition;
- ◇ Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horses.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

SOME EQUINE CANADA RULES

Competitors should be aware of the following:

Only parents/legal guardians may sign the liability waiver form on behalf of a minor child. Trainers, coaches, agents, etc may no longer sign this form.

A Junior under 10 years of age does not require a Sport License. All competitors 10 years of age and over must have a Sport License for the level required – Bronze, Silver or Gold.

PERSON RESPONSIBLE: The Person Responsible for a horse is an adult, who has, or shares, responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rules and is liable under penalty provisions of the Rules for any violation of the EC Rules. The Person Responsible must hold an EC sport license (see A203.5). In the case of junior entries, parents or guardians are entitled to sign their children's entry form without holding an EC Sport License, provided they agree to abide by the rules and penalties contained in the Rule Book. (See A214.2). For the purpose of these Rules, the Person Responsible is normally the trainer, owner or the competitor who rides or drives the horse during an event or a parent or legal guardian in the case of junior competitors. The person Responsible is ultimately responsible for the condition, fitness and management of the horse and is alone responsible for any act performed in the stables by himself or herself or by any other person with authorized access to the horse, or while the horse is being ridden, driven or exercised.

It is compulsory for the horse's competition number to be worn by the horse or rider/handler anywhere outside the stall from the time that the number is issued until the end of the competition so that officials can identify the horse.

In the case of a fall of horse and/or rider, while in the competition arena, the rider will be eliminated immediately from the class.

Junior competitors must wear properly fitted, approved protective headgear, with the safety harness correctly secured at all times while mounted on the competition or event grounds. Approved headgear must be certified by SEI or another testing body that it meets the American Society for Testing Materials (ASTM) standard or the British Standards Institute (BSI) standard. *Please note that helmets purchased in other countries may be certified for those countries, but are not certified for juniors riding in Canadian dressage shows unless they display the SEI, ASTM, or BSI certification.* This ruling applies at Bronze, Silver, and Gold EC sanctioned competitions. Juniors not complying with the rule will not be allowed to compete in competitions that require approved headgear. It is strongly recommended that all persons wear approved headgear with secured and properly fitted harnesses at all times while mounted. Any competitor may wear protective headgear in any division or class without penalty from the judge.

A horse/pony may be ridden at two consecutive levels with the same or two different riders but may not be entered in the same class with two different riders.

No horse/pony may be ridden in more than four tests (including the freestyle) in one day. A horse/rider combination may compete in a maximum of two consecutive EC freestyle levels per day. These must correspond to the technical levels at which the horse/rider combination is competing on the same day; e.g: Second Level technical plus First and Second Level freestyles.

For freestyles, the rider must provide the show organizer with two functioning copies of their freestyle music which can be played on a CD player or tape deck and not just on a computer.

Freestyle eligibility for riders in Gold and Silver competitions (all EC levels and FEI freestyle levels): A horse/rider combination must have obtained the following prior to competing in a freestyle: a minimum score of 55% in a dressage test at the same technical level, or higher, as the freestyle they wish to enter (e.g. 55% in First or Second Level to compete in the First and/or Second Level Freestyle). The dressage score may have been obtained at an EC Gold/Silver dressage competition prior to the competition, or may be obtained at the same competition in which they wish to enter the freestyle. **Note:** Bronze competitions require no minimum technical score.

Technical scores earned at Silver competitions count toward entering a Freestyle in a Gold competition and vice versa.

Horses must enter the ring within **45** seconds of the bell or whistle but must **not** enter the ring before the bell or whistle.

Riders must report, still mounted, to the steward or his/her representative for a tack check immediately upon leaving the competition arena. The rider may not remove any equipment or clothing before the steward has conducted their inspection. At the tack check a junior may be asked to dismount to allow an inspection of their headgear.

A rider who is eliminated during a test must still report to the steward for a tack check.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- ❑ **NEW IN 2011** – Horse/rider combinations entered in Walk/Trot classes may *NOT* enter Training or First level classes (unless hors concours).
- ❑ **NEW IN 2011**- Entries will be date stamped and, in the case of over-subscription, NO late entries will be accepted. Should the show become over-subscribed prior to the entries closing, QSLB members will be granted preferred entry.
- ❑ No horse /pony may be ridden in more than 4 tests (including freestyle) in one day.
- ❑ All classes in all shows will be offered as Open. Senior and Junior results will be calculated separately for Year End awards.
- ❑ When there is only one horse in any class, ribbons and prizes shall be awarded in accordance with the following chart of percentage:
 - ❑ 1st – 60% or higher
 - ❑ 2nd – 57% to 59.9%
 - ❑ 3rd – 54% to 56.9%
 - ❑ 4th – 51% to 53.9%
- ❑ No ribbons or prizes shall be awarded below 4th place.
- ❑ It is compulsory for the horse's competition number to be worn by the horse or rider/handler anywhere outside the stall from the time that the number is issued until the end of the competition so that officials can identify the horse.
- ❑ For the Gold and Silver shows, all horses must have a passport and a valid EC horse license (sticker in the passport) to compete. If owned by a temporary sport license holder, a temporary horse registration form must be purchased at each competition entered.
- ❑ Any horse entered in any class at a competition subject to the requirement to pay drug testing fees may, while on the competition grounds, be selected for equine medication control testing.
- ❑ Refunds/Scratches: There will be NO refunds after the closing date of entries. In the event the competition has to be cancelled, refunds will be given after all expenses to the organizing committee are covered.
- ❑ Hors concours entries will be accepted if time permits.
- ❑ Non-competing horses, at the sole discretion of the show organizer, will be allowed but must pay the administration fee in order to receive a number.
- ❑ QSLB, show organizers and facility owners take no responsibility for any loss, theft, or damage to any equipment.
- ❑ Insurance: Competitors are responsible for all insurance to themselves, employees, owners and horses, etc. All owners are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance to provide full coverage for participation in equestrian events and to keep the policy up to date. (or to ensure that their memberships, such as OEF, provide such insurance in such situations.)

SHOW INFORMATION

BRONZE INFORMATION AND CLASSES OFFERED

Memberships required for Bronze Competitions: OEF (Ontario Equestrian Federation) membership, EC (Equine Canada) Bronze Sport License.

Special QSLB Introductory Offer: Riders who have never competed in any QSLB shows may compete for one full season at any QSLB Bronze show including the Bronze Championship without becoming a QSLB member. Such riders are not eligible for Year End awards. This means that you pay the member administration fee of \$10 instead of the non-member fee of \$25.

Each test offered will have a Pony class and an Open class. Ponies may show in either the open classes or the pony classes but not both. Only Junior competitors are eligible to compete in a Pony class.

BRONZE DRESSAGE CHAMPIONSHIPS – INFORMATION

- ◇ To qualify for the QSLB Bronze Dressage Championships, you must be a QSLB member (unless competing under the 'Special QSLB Introductory Offer').
- ◇ Horse/rider combination must have entered and competed in at least TWO QSLB Bronze shows.
- ◇ Horse/rider combination CANNOT have competed in any Gold shows in 2011.
- ◇ Horse/rider combination MAY have competed in ONE Silver show in 2011.
- ◇ Championship scores will NOT count towards QSLB year-end awards.
- ◇ **NOTE: HORSE/RIDER COMBINATIONS ENTERED IN WALK/TROT CLASSES MAY *NOT* ENTER TRAINING OR FIRST LEVEL CLASSES**
- ◇ Walk/Trot and Training Level Tests will be in the 20x40 ring
- ◇ First Level Tests will be in the 20x60 ring
- ◇ Whips may be carried and readers are allowed.

QSLB ANNUAL AWARDS PROGRAM FOR 2011

1. Riders must be members of QSLB in order to be eligible for these awards.
2. Competitors must be members of QSLB prior to final show (September) to be eligible for year-end awards.
3. Only QSLB Bronze, Silver or Gold show results may be used to tabulate the winners. **Bronze Championship scores will NOT count towards year-end awards.
4. Any shows not represented in the QSLB prize list are not QSLB shows and will not be used for tabulating QSLB awards.
5. Horse/rider combination must have entered, competed in, and have scores from, at least two shows.

AWARDS – BRONZE SHOWS

(QSLB members only are eligible - riders must be QSLB members)

Champion and Reserve: Junior and Senior, Walk/Trot only, based on the total of your best two scores over 50%, from 2 different judges at two different shows, excluding Freestyles.

Champion and Reserve: Junior and Senior, Training and First, based on the total of your best two scores over 50%, from 2 different judges at two different shows, excluding Freestyles.

Junior and Senior 'High Scores' will be calculated at each show, open to Non-Members. These ribbons will be presented at our end of year banquet.

AWARDS – SILVER SHOWS

(QSLB members only are eligible - riders must be QSLB members)

Champion and Reserve: Junior and Senior, Training to Fourth Level, based on the total of your best two scores over 50%, from 2 different judges at two different shows, excluding Freestyles.

Junior and Senior 'High Scores' will be calculated at each show, open to Non-Members. These ribbons will be presented at our end of year banquet.

AWARDS – GOLD SHOWS

(QSLB members only are eligible - riders must be QSLB members)

Champion and Reserve: Junior and Senior, Training to GP, based on the total of your two best scores over 50%, from 2 different judges at two different shows, excluding Freestyles.

Junior and Senior 'High Scores' will be calculated at each show, open to Non-Members. These ribbons will be presented at our end of year banquet.

OTHER QSLB AWARDS

High Score: Junior and Senior. Based on the highest score achieved in any single EC test at any 2011 QSLB Bronze, Silver or Gold show, excluding Freestyles and Walk/Trot.

Freestyle Special: Donated by Susan & Greg Leggatt.

Based upon the accumulation of Freestyle scores PLUS the best single technical test score at the same level. There must be a minimum of 3 different horse/rider combinations eligible for this award to be presented.

Dressage Junior Rider Award: Donated by Linda Murphy.

Based upon the accumulation of scores in all classes for tests ridden by a Junior Rider (under 18). A single rider may ride as many different horses as she/he wishes and can compete in as many classes as she/he is eligible.

DIRECTIONS TO SHOW SITES

DOORNEKAMP'S

From Hwy 401, Wilton Rd North (exit 599). Turn left onto Scotland Rd (first road, ½ km), farm is at end of road.

EVERGREEN FARM

From Hwy 401, Sydenham Rd N (exit 613). Go North 2km, turn right (east) onto Burbrook Rd at flashing light. After 2km, turn left onto Colehill Rd. Farm is on left, large green sign.

PEVERIL FARM

From 401, exit at Wilton Road (Amherstview). Travel north, thru Yarker, Colebrook & Moscow. North Road East is on the right.

From Ottawa/Perth – 417 west to Highway 7, continue west to highway 38 (Sharbot Lake). South on #38 to Verona, Just thru village, turn right (west) on Bellrock Road (#14). Just before the Village of Enterprise, turn left (South) on Moscow Road. North Road East will be on your left.

OR

Highway 15 South through Smith's Falls & past Seeleys' Bay. Turn right (West) on Sunbury Road to Sunbury. Turn left (South) in Sunbury, and then make an immediate right (West) just past the gas station onto Moreland-Dixon Road. Make a right (north) at the end of Moreland-Dixon, go through Inverary to Rutledge Road. Turn left (West). Go through Sydenham to Harrowsmith, where you will now be at the junction of Highway #38. Turn Left (South) and make an IMMEDIATE right onto Colebrook Road (NOT onto Yarker Road). Follow Colebrook Road through the village of Colebrook and Moscow. North Road East is on the right.
